New Government Privacy Regulation affect Hospital Visiting

It is now the **responsibility of the patient**, or relative of that patient, to directly contact their minister or request a hospital pastoral carer to contact a minister or chaplain on their own behalf.



Without a specific request hospital staff cannot contact a minister or chaplain so **you will not get visited**. This new regulation is being introduced across Australia and already applies to Calvary Lenah Valley and St Johns Hospitals in Hobart.

I have just heard from a person angry, after a month in hospital, without a visit and neither their minister nor the UCA Chaplain at Calvary even knew they were in hospital. Please remember **if you don't tell us we don't know**.

ABOUT MABOŃ ...

Mabo Day on June 3rd marks the conclusion of National Reconciliation Week and is a significant day in our national history.

On Mabo Day, we honour the leadership, determination and courage of Eddie 'Koiki' Mabo.

His achievement, along with David Passi and the late James Rice, in securing **recognition of his people's ongoing title to their own lands and waters** was a watershed moment in Australia's history.

It holds enormous significance, not only for Torres Strait Islanders, but for Aboriginal people across the nation and for Australians everywhere.

The High Court ruling in the Mabo case acknowledged in Australian law a simple truth . someone was already here at the time the British colonies were established, overturning the legal doctrine of terra nullius.

On this day, 25 years on, we honour this great Meriam man from Mer Island in the Torres Strait.

We pay tribute to his family, whose commitment helped our nation to see more clearly the profound and continuing relationship of Torres Strait Islander and Aboriginal peoples with their traditional lands and waters.

And **we remember Eddie 'Koiki' Mabo, a man who gave us a glimpse of how Australia could know itself more deeply, more truthfully** . and be the better for it.
