Aboriginal Deaths in Custody remains an ongoing injustice in these lands now called Australia. On 15 July the 10th Aboriginal person since March this year died in custody. This year also marks 30 years since the Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody. Since this time, there have been almost 500 deaths in custody and many of the 339 recommendations from this Commission have never been implemented. It is an injustice that breaks the heart of God, and an injustice that compels us, as followers of Jesus, to action.

This year marks five years since his death in custody in South Australia and Wayne's Coronial Inquest continues today. #JusticeForFella #BanSpitHoods

Wayne's mother Aunty Caroline Anderson said in July, "Every day we go without answers is another day I can't mourn for my son. Five years is too long."

#### **Narrative Lectionary**:

<u>Proposed toilet development at Glenorchy</u> Tasmanian government has confirmed the promised grant of \$114000 to Glenorchy Community Care Inc. for toilet renovation and car park re-surfacing. Two forms, required by Presbytery regarding the development of the toilets, had to receive Church council approval.

Agreed to approve the required forms with the understanding that we are committing ourselves to a longer-term use of the Glenorchy U C Hall and recognising that along with this there is need for a longer-term commitment to Glenorchy Community Care Inc. Most leases between hall users and the church are for 1 year at a time, however, the next lease for GCC Inc. will be for several years e.g. maybe for 5 years
