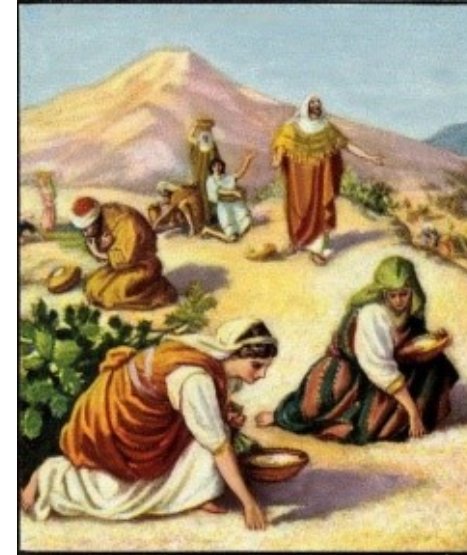

Garry is a Trawlolaway man from northern Lutrawita (Tasmania), an Anglican priest, and the Vice-Chancellor's Fellow in Indigenous theologies at the University of Divinity.

Garry has had a diverse ministry for 30 years including in the employ of the Uniting Church in Victoria and Tasmania. He is the author of *The Bonds of Theology and Gondwana Theology*, and is a regular contributor to radio, podcasts, and conferences on Indigenous matters.

Garry will be speaking on:

'Who are the First Nations/First Peoples of this country, and what is our traditional spirituality or way of life?'

'What happened between First Peoples and (mainly European) colonists in the period 1788-1960?'

'What do modern-day Indigenous people want?'

'Who are the Second Peoples and how can they be good allies in the Indigenous struggle for something resembling justice?'
